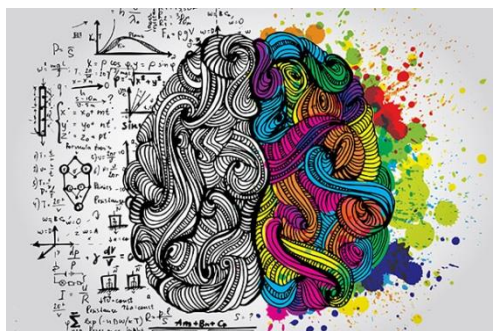


“Electroconvulsive Therapy- from 1938 to 2019 and beyond ”

Dr Rohan Taylor (Consultant Psychiatrist, ECT practitioner) with colleague Karen Wells (Consumer Coordinator at Partners in Recovery), will discuss “ECT Let’s talk about it” project, including a history of the evolution of ECT, lived experience of consumers who have had or continue to have treatment, and the future of ECT as an effective treatment option.



“NDIS- how to guide”

James Everingham hails from SLHD, and is involved in assisting the district with NDIS transition including strategic oversight of the implementation of the SLHD Disability Action Plan. Susan Badawy is a psychologist, behaviour support specialist at FACS, and senior manager at The Benevolent Society. They will focus on their experience of NDIS to date, and supports being implemented for staff to help patients in navigating the system.

“Working with transgender and gender diverse clients”

Sarah Bowman (Psychologist + MH advocate for the transgender community), and Dr Elizabeth Riley (counsellor and clinical supervisor) have worked in the trans community for years, including working with children, adolescents, families, and adults. They will provide an overview of working with these individuals and their families, and an insight into the overall experience.

“Virtual Reality & treating PTSD and pain”

Dr Andrew Campbell, registered psychologist and lead researcher at The University of Sydney Cyberpsychology Research Group, will give a brief overview on the use of Virtual Reality in client healthcare, with highlights on the treatment of PTSD and pain management in patients.

“Fire setting amongst the mentally disorderd”

Vindya Nayakkara is a psychologist with a specialisation in forensic mental health. She is a conjoint lecturer at UNSW, and will be completing a PhD in deliberate fire setting.
